Missing persons listed on Web

New Internet site ask public help solving Pennsylvania cases

A Web site recently was launched to help police solve missing persons mysteries in Pennsylvania by promoting public awareness of such cases.

Doe Network -- an international center for unidentified and missing persons, covering cases in the United States, Canada, Australia and Europe -- has started www.pennsylvaniamissing.com.

The Web site shows pictures of missing people and gives information such as height, eye color, last location seen and circumstances of the person's disappearance.

Age progression images also are provided, showing how people missing since they were young may look now.

The Web site also gives information for contacting police agencies investigating the cases.

"Any place that you're able to put accurate information about a missing person, child or adult, where somebody may see it, is always helpful," said Cpl. Wayne Sheppard of the Pennsylvania State Police Missing Persons Unit in Harrisburg. "Someone may see it and say, 'I remember seeing this person.'"

"So having this Web site available could be a good thing."

Missing persons listed

Three people from Adams County are listed among the missing at www.pennsylvaniamissing.com.

---Tracy Anne King, who has been missing since July 8, 1975, from Littlestown. At the time, she was 14 years old, 5-foot-3 with a scar on her right ankle. Born Oct. 11, 1960, King would now be 43.
